Benha city











Benha is considered one of the most prominent cities in the Nile Delta, north of Cairo. It is the capital of Qalyubia Governorate and is distinguished by its strategic location on the bank of the Damietta branch of the Nile, in the heart of the Egyptian Delta. The population of Benha city is estimated at approximately 187,469 according to a recent 2023 census, while the population of the "city plus surrounding areas/suburbs" reaches about 709,658. Benha is located roughly 48 to 53 kilometers from Cairo. Surrounded by water on most sides, Benha is regarded as a highly significant city

Economy of Benha:

Economically and agriculturally, Benha is known as a fertile agricultural region. It produces long-staple cotton and wheat, and in the past, it was famous for producing "attar of roses." Today, Benha has also become an important center for industry, particularly electronics. The city combines modernity, industry, agriculture, and history. Its proximity to Cairo allows it to maintain its unique identity as an agricultural and industrial hub and as a connecting point between the capital and the Delta.

History and Name of Benha:

Benha originated as an ancient Egyptian village and was originally called the Pharaonic name "Binyha", which evolved into today's Benha. The name is a compound of two parts: "Bi," meaning house or enclosure, and "Nha," meaning the sycamore tree—together meaning "Sycamore Enclosure." The ancient Egyptians used the wood of these trees for making coffins, furniture, and statues. Later, the ruler Abbas Helmy built a palace in Benha. In 1850, he ordered the transfer of the Directorate Office from Qalyubia to Benha, which was then administratively part of the Toukh district. Benha became the capital of Qalyubia Governorate in 1960.

The Establishment of Benha University



Benha University was established by a decree on November 25, 1976, as a branch of Zagazig University, initially comprising the following faculties: Medicine, Agriculture, Shubra Engineering, and Education. Over time, more faculties were added, bringing the total to 11 faculties within the branch. In 2005, the university became independent from Zagazig University and was officially recognized as a separate university. Since then, additional faculties have been established, and by 2025, Benha University includes 17 faculties and 1 institute.

Establishment of the Faculty of Specific Education:

Based on Ministerial Decree No. 150 dated 19/2/1990, the regulations for Faculties of Specific Education were issued. Subsequently, Ministerial Decree No. 884 dated 11/8/1980 approved the establishment of the Faculty of Specific Education in Qalyubiya Governorate, located in the former Teachers' Training Institute building in Benha. The duration of study at the faculty was set at four years, ending with the award of a Bachelor's degree in one of the offered specializations. The faculty graduated its first cohort across all departments in the academic year 1993/1994. It was then affiliated with Zagazig University, Benha Branch, in 1998. After Benha University became independent from Zagazig University in August 2005, the faculty officially became one of Benha University's faculties. The faculty's system also allows the admission of international students. In 2006, the faculty prepared a new Bachelor's program regulation based on the academic-year system, along with a postgraduate regulation based on the credit-hour system. In 2010, the departments of the Faculty of Specific Education were merged with the Faculty of Education following a decision issued by the Supreme Council of the Armed Forces, which resulted in the cancellation of the Faculty of Specific Education. However, in 2012, the faculty was reinstated to its original status by a decree issued by the President of the Republic.

Policies for Attracting International Students:

- 1. Announcing the distinguished status of the Faculty of Specific Education as a faculty affiliated with Benha University through the faculty's official website.
- 2. Highlighting the various capabilities and unique features of the faculty on its website.
- 3. Showcasing the academic standing of faculty members and the scientific awards they have received on the faculty's website.
- 4. Announcing the faculty's academic programs both undergraduate and postgraduate on the website, and preparing brochures to be sent to the concerned authorities.
- 5. Preparing a periodic bulletin on the faculty's activities in the postgraduate studies sector and publishing it on the official website.
- 6. Organizing orientation meetings to welcome new international students, introduce them to the faculty, and encourage cultural dialogue among different nationalities.

Mechanisms for Supporting International Students:

- 1. Facilitating and following up on all procedures related to enrollment, registration, and graduation for students.
- 2. Assigning a dedicated staff member at the faculty to communicate with students and help resolve any difficulties they may face.
- 3. Completing all required security procedures for each student.
- 4. Coordinating with various embassies and the International Students Administration at the Ministry of Higher Education to finalize all matters related to international students and resolve their issues.
- 5. Facilitating accommodation in university-affiliated housing facilities.
- 6. Introducing international students to faculty members and highlighting the awards and recognition the staff have received.
- 7. Holding regular meetings between international students and the International Students Office to discuss any challenges they face and work toward solving them.

It also trains students in various journalistic and broadcasting arts, including news writing, article and report writing, documentation methods, and conducting investigations and interviews.

Students join the department as majors in Journalism and Broadcasting starting from the first academic level. Over the course of eight levels, students study more than 150 credit hours, including university requirements, educational courses, and specialized media courses.

Upon reaching the eighth level, each student submits a graduation project in the fields of journalism, radio, or television.

Currently, a new program in Digital Media is being developed to align with modern trends, technological advancements, and labor market needs. Enrollment in this program will begin very soon.

The Home Economics Department is one of the distinguished departments in the faculty, and it is divided into three specializations:

1. Home Management Division:

This division focuses on studying how to manage the home, family budgeting, setting family priorities, preserving the environment, and rationalizing consumption.

2. Nutrition and Food Sciences:

One of the most prominent divisions in the department, highly favored by students due to its focus on clinical nutrition for patients and specialized nutrition for various groups such as pregnant women, breastfeeding mothers, adolescents, and individuals with obesity, providing them with appropriate dietary plans.

3. Clothing and Textiles Division:

Students learn many skills in this division, including embroidery, knitting, crochet, and all types of tailoring—even evening gown design. They also study printing techniques using both traditional and modern methods, as well as fashion design.

The department enables students to understand essential information about how to handle household appliances, sewing tools, and sewing machines. Students also gain knowledge about choosing clothing, its historical development, clothing requirements for each developmental stage, the factors influencing clothing selection, types of yarns and fabrics, and textile design and printing.

The Educational Technology Department is a central department that strives to prepare educational technology specialists and computer teachers according to the credit-hour system.

Main Objective of the Department:

Preparing graduates capable of developing the educational process and contributing to meeting the needs of the labor market, while adhering to national standards.

Key Knowledge and Skills Acquired

- Knowledge and Application: Equipping students with the fundamental concepts and principles of educational technology and computer science, including programming skills, as well as deepening their understanding of the educational, technical, and psychological foundations of instructional design.
- Practical Skills: Mastering the design and production of learning resources and employing them in education; developing research and analytical skills; and acquiring the competencies needed to manage libraries and information resource centers.
- Personal Skills: Enhancing creativity, improving effective communication skills, and developing self-learning, collaborative learning, and time-management abilities.

Additional Responsibilities of the Department Head (International Students Affairs):

- Guiding international students and helping them understand department regulations.
- Evaluating the performance of the teaching staff and facilitating communication with international students.
- Organizing lecture-related activities and assigning tasks related to international students to department members.

Through this, students graduate as well-qualified specialists capable of mastering technology and keeping pace with labor-market requirements.

The Importance of the Educational Technology Department The Educational Technology Department is one of the most important departments in Faculties of Education and Specific Education. Despite this, some may view it narrowly as being limited to devices, equipment, and teaching aids. Admission of International Students

- 1. Many Arab and African students seek to study in Egypt, and some are unfamiliar with the application procedures. The Student Guide provides the required steps for applying.
- 2. Applications for admission are submitted through the International Information Network via the official website of the International Students Admission System for new applicants:https://wafeden.gov.eg or through the same link accessed from the website of the Cultural Affairs and Missions Sector of the Ministry: www.mohe-casm.edu.eg
- 3. The General Administration for the Admission and Grants of International Students at the Ministry will handle the procedures for accepted students for the academic year, in coordination with the relevant authorities. The university will then be informed of the final approval of their admission.
- 4. For returning students, applications for re-nomination, re-enrollment (for those who exceeded the allowed number of failure attempts), transfer, change of enrollment, or completion of studies must be submitted to the General Administration for the Admission and Grants of International Students at the Ministry.
- 5. Students transferring from Syria, Libya, and Yemen must apply directly to the faculty they wish to transfer to, submitting a request accompanied by proof of enrollment in an equivalent faculty at a Syrian public university. They will then receive an initial approval letter addressed to the General Administration for the Admission and Grants of International Students at the Ministry. This initial approval does not constitute final admission. Final acceptance is granted only after the Ministry reviews their documents to ensure that they meet the transfer requirements, and the student must apply through the website of the Cultural Affairs and Missions Sector: www.mohe-casm.edu.egAfter completing the review, the university will receive the final approval of the transfer

6. Each year, and based on the recommendations of university councils, the universities determine the acceptance of non-Egyptian students. Their admission is finalized by a decision issued by the Minister of Higher Education. Their transfer and change of enrollment are also decided by the Minister. In all cases, the number of accepted or transferred international students in any faculty must not exceed 10% of the number of Egyptian students admitted to that faculty.

Required Documents According to the Rules of the General Administration for the Admission and Granting of International Students:

Three completed data forms written clearly, including the student's name as in the passport, academic certificates, and addresses inside and outside the country, with the college's and university's approval and official stamps.

- Copies of the student's academic qualifications, clearly shown.
- A complete and valid copy of the passport (valid for more than one year).
- Copy of certificate equivalency from the Supreme Council of Universities.
- A letter from the embassy indicating the entity funding the student's study and the academic degree the student intends to pursue, matching the data form and academic year.
- Four copies of the information form, including all required data.
- Proof of electronic submission on the website of the General Administration for International Students.

How to Apply for Registration for New International Students:

- A personal interview test will be conducted with new students with a fee of EGP 500.
- The student submits their application to the postgraduate studies department of the college to obtain preliminary approval for registration, attaching the above-mentioned documents and their academic qualifications and equivalency certificates. All documents must be complete and valid. The college council reviews the documents, provides preliminary approval, and sends them to the General Administration for Postgraduate Studies for further review, then to the Postgraduate Studies Council for principle approval.

 After approval from the General Administration for International Students at the Ministry of Higher Education, the college is officially informed of the final approval, which is then ratified by the Postgraduate Studies and Research Council.

Conditions for Admission of International Students:

- 1. Acceptance of international students must be based on original official certificates authenticated by their home countries.
- 2. Admission is granted with the approval of the university president or his deputies after confirming that all conditions and rules for admission, transfer, or re-registration are met according to the Minister of Higher Education's decision.
- 3. Ministerial Decree No. 870, dated 25/8/1983, regarding the admission of international students, states:
 - a. The number of international students accepted must not exceed 10% of the total number of Egyptian students in each faculty, except for medicine, dentistry, and pharmacy faculties, where the limit is 5%.
 - b. Distribution of the percentage across faculties and nationalities is coordinated with the Arab Affairs Office at the Ministry of Foreign Affairs.
- 4. The student must meet all admission conditions applicable to Egyptian students, including passing required courses and exams, and for foreign languages not studied in previous certificates, a supplementary exam must be passed before obtaining the bachelor's degree.
- 5. The General Administration for International Students communicates acceptance papers to the Ministry of Foreign Affairs, the Arab Affairs Office, the Presidency, and relevant embassies, according to allocated quotas, by August 31 each year. Embassies must submit approved student papers by September 30. Only original certificates are accepted; copies are not.

- 6. Students cannot be nominated for more than one seat, except if a seat becomes vacant. Changes must be coordinated through the General Administration for International Students.
- 7. The General Administration prepares lists of nominated students for each faculty, indicating:
 - a- Nationality
 - b- Percentage score
 - c- Minimum acceptance score for the nominated faculty. These lists are sent to the Arab Affairs Office for approval, then to the Minister of Higher Education, and finally to the respective universities.
- 8. The General Administration informs nominating entities of acceptance results so they can notify the students to complete registration procedures at the respective faculties and institutes.

Admission of International Students for Undergraduate Programs:

- 1. International students with Egyptian Thanaweya Amma or equivalent intermediate certificates follow the same coordination as Egyptian students, processed via the General Administration for International Students.
- 2. Students with foreign equivalency certificates residing in Egypt permanently coordinate with Egyptian students for admission through the General Administration for International Students.
- 3. Students applying through embassies with a high school certificate from their home country follow a special procedure in August each year via the General Administration.

Re-nomination for New Students:

If a nominated student does not complete registration, they may be re-nominated for the following year in the same faculty, provided their score allows, through the General Administration for International Students.

Re-registration for Students Exhausting Attempts:

- 1. Obtain an academic record from the previously attended college.
- 2. Submit all student documents.
- 3. Re-registration is done via the General Administration for International Students.

Transfers:

- 1. Transfers between foreign and Egyptian universities, or between Egyptian faculties, require approval from the Minister of Higher Education.
- 2. Transfers are not allowed for the first year or preparatory year.
- 3. Article 170 of the Universities Organization Law applies for exemption from attending previously passed courses.
- 4. Transfers must be from one faculty to a higher level within another faculty.
- 5. Obtain an academic record from the previous faculty.
- 6. Approval is required from the faculty receiving the student.
- 7. The General Administration handles transfers after coordination with the university's administration.

Change of Registration (Non-equivalent Faculties):

Transferring from one non-equivalent faculty to another requires the student's score to meet faculty requirements, processed via the General Administration.

Suspension of Registration:

- 1. Applies only to new students.
- 2. Suspension is for one academic year and handled via the General Administration.

Excuses:

International students are treated the same as Egyptian students for all excused absences.

II. Postgraduate Programs:

Admission System for Postgraduate Studies:

- 1. Applications are submitted through faculties.
- 2. The student fills out an admission form within the faculty, approved by the Dean and the Vice President for Postgraduate Studies and Research.
- 3. The university's International Students Office sends forms and copies of documents to the General Administration for International Students in Cairo.
- 4. Approval is issued from the General Administration, and the student is registered only after notifying the Vice President for Postgraduate Studies.
- 5. Scholarship students are nominated through the General Administration; no fees are charged, typically paid in Egyptian pounds.
- 6. Master's and PhD students pay an initial registration fee and annual tuition until thesis defense.
- 7. Diploma students pay tuition and registration fees, only for a first failure.

 Subsequent registration or transfer requires General Administration approval.

Required Documents for Postgraduate Admission:

- 1. Three completed admission data forms, approved by the Dean and University President.
- 2. Three information forms.
- 3. Original graduation certificate authenticated by the embassy.
- 4. Original birth certificate.
- 5. Recent passport copy.
- 6. Equivalency certificate from the Supreme Council of Universities.
- 7. Embassy letter indicating funding or scholarship.
- 8. Health certificate.
- 9. Approved data forms and copies are sent to the General Administration in Cairo; originals are kept at the faculty.
- 10. Fees are paid to the university's account at the Arab African Bank. The faculty registers deposit receipt numbers in the student file for postgraduate records.
